Recommendation 1:

Honor Career Ladder Level Certificates as Waivers of Required Preparation Programs Individual License Designations: ECE I, II, III

Recommendation: For a limited time during the transition to the profession, honor <u>Northern</u> <u>Lights Career Ladder Level Certificates</u> as equivalent to the preparation programs that will be required in the future.

Career Ladder Level II Certificate = eligible to apply for ECE I Licensure Career Ladder Level III-B Certificate = eligible to apply for ECE II Licensure Career Ladder Level IV-A Certificate or higher = eligible to apply for ECE III Licensure *What about Level III-A?

Design teams are still working out how Career Ladder Level III-A fits into the plan for waivers.

Recommendation 2:

Prior Learning Assessment as a Flexible Approach to Demonstrate Competence Individual License Designation: ECE II Transition License

Recommendation: For a limited time during the transition to the profession, experienced early childhood educators who do not have an associate degree may successfully complete one of the Prior Learning Assessment options at Community College of Vermont to become eligible for an ECE II Transition License.

Flexible options to show what you know are available through the Prior Learning Assessment programs at Community College of Vermont. These options are credit-bearing, stackable, efficient, and cost-effective. Participating educators will show that they meet the objectives of four courses aligned with NAEYC's Professional Standards and Competencies: Introduction to Early Childhood Education Child Development Communication in the Early Childhood Education and After School Workplace Curriculum Development for Early Childhood Education

Option 1: Competency-Based Pathways

- Independent option
- Cost: \$150 fee for each of the four Competency-Based Pathways
- Standardized assignments aligned with objectives for each of the four courses
- Fully online
- A faculty member evaluates your learning

Option 2: Focused Portfolio Development

- Supportive learning community option
- Cost: One-credit tuition and related fees (\$580)
- One-credit course offered spring, summer, and fall semesters
- Fully online or online with scheduled Zoom sessions
- Create a portfolio that provides documentation for up to 16 credits of college-level learning
